



THE FRYSKE AKADEMY IN 2014

Scholarly Research

The Fryske Akademy focuses on scholarly research into change processes within the Frisian language, multilingualism, history and regional identity, both in the past and in the present.

Institutional and Social Integration and Cooperation The Administrative Arrangement for the

Frisian Language and Culture that was signed in the spring of 2013 by the Central Government and Fryslân Province secures and strengthens the ties with the KNAW up until 2018. As in previous years, the bond between the Fryske Akademy and Fryslân Province was reinforced by the additional research grants awarded to the Fryske Akademy in 2014.

The various working groups play an important role in the social integration of the Fryske Akademy in the region. The members of these groups focus on activities that are usually not part of the research agenda of the FA staff. They organise lectures, workshops and publications. The annual series of Akademy lectures routinely drew audiences of around 150 people in 2014.

Collaborative ventures with provincial institutions such as Tresoar, Historisch Centrum Leeuwarden, Cedin, Partoer, Afûk, University Campus Fryslân and the Fries Museum are concerned, among other things, with the continuation of the *digi*tisation master plan (financed with NUON funds) and the organisation of the 'Marijke

Meu year', in remembrance of the 250th anniversary of the death of Maria Louise van Kassel. In addition, the FA participates in the *De Verbinding* network, instigated by Mayor Ferd Crone of Leeuwarden, together with representatives from the Frisian business sector, knowledge institutions and colleges. Finally, the FA started work on several projects within the framework of Leeuwarden Cultural Capital 2018.



In Language Portal, subsidised by the Netherlands Organisation for Scientific Research NWO, the Fryske Akademy collaborates with the Meertens Institute, the Institute for Dutch Lexicography INL and Leiden University. Language Web was developed in close cooperation with Gridline, a company from Amsterdam, and with input from the INL on the compilation of the standard word list.

The *HISGIS* project is carried out together with a large number of research partners, such as the Netherlands Interdisciplinary



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
Doctoral Research



Demographic Institute NIDI, Data Archiving and Network Services DANS, the Centre for Urban History of the University of Amsterdam, the Geography Department of that same university, the Centre for the History of the City of Antwerp University, and the Land Registry Office and Archives of the

Province of Drenthe. In 2014, the cooperation with institutions and authorities in the provinces of Limburg, Brabant and Gelderland

was intensified. The existing cooperation with National movements & Intermediary Structures in Europe NISE (Antwerp) was continued. Marijn Molema founded the EDR network project, in cooperation with the Ostfriesische Landschaft, Groningen University (RUG), the Emden Library, and the Archives of the Province of Drenthe, NLA-Niedersachsen, and the Fries Museum. Molema collaborated with the Noordoost-Friesland region on research into the causes of regional demographic shrinkage. The *Language Survey* project, conducted by Edwin Klinkenberg, draws from input from regional organisations such as Afûk, Partoer and Cedin. On the Advisory Board are representatives from Groningen University, Radboud University and the University of the Basque Country. Furthermore, the Fryske Akademy is a partner in the doctorate and post-doctorate research of the KNAW *eHumanities* project called *The Riddle of Literary Quality*, which is led by the Huygens Institute of Netherlands History. The FA is also a partner in the Prize Papers network,



together with the National Library of the Netherlands, the Huygens ING, Leiden University, the Meertens Institute and the National Archives. The PhD programmes are carried out in cooperation with the universities of Leiden, Groningen, Utrecht and Amsterdam.

The Mercator European Research Centre for Multilingualism and Language Learning is part of an international network. In 2014, the Basque government, which had always been a leading partner, decided to end its involvement for economic reasons. Within the framework of the *LangOER* network project, Mercator manages the cooperation between Web2learn (Greece), European Schoolnet (Belgium), Gothenburg University (Sweden), Jan Dlugosz University (Poland), Mykolas Romeris University (Lithuania), the International Council for Open and Distance Education (ICDE) (Norway), the European Foundation for Quality in E-learning (Belgium) and the Rezekne Higher Education Institution (Letland).

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

On Akademy Day, 12 September 2014, six new members were appointed. Dr Arjen Dijkstra and Dr Nanna Haug Hilton (both from Groningen University) were appointed on account of their contributions to science. The tenor Albert Bonnema, Tjibbele Miedema, Tryater director Ira Judkovskaja, and writer and journalist Huub Mous were appointed on account of their 'contributions to the Frisian culture'. On the occasion of his farewell as interim chairman of the Social Advisory Council, Theunis Piersma was also appointed member on account of his 'contributions to the Frisian culture'. Lexicographer Dr Anne Dykstra was appointed member on the occasion of his retirement, on account of his contributions to science. By the end of 2014, the Fryske Akademy had 310 members



Construction and Renovation

After the results of the invitation to tender were known, the construction and renovation phases began. The demolition work started in August, and the first pile of the new building on the Groeneweg was driven on 8 October. Subsequently, work started on the Aljemint, which is turned into an office building with 23 fixed workplaces and an additional 9 flexible workplaces. The restoration plans for the Coulonhûs were initiated as well; these will be financed through separate fundraising.
