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## **The Fryske Akademy in 2023**

Since its founding in 1938, the Fryske Akademy has been dedicated to fundamental and applied scientific research into the Frisian language and culture. Eighty-five years later, this mission entrusted by the Frisian society at its founding still guides the institution.

#### **General Developments**

The year 2023 primarily marked a successful continuation of the paths embarked upon in 2022. Internally, the focus was on the further development of the organisation in accordance with the Strategic Policy Plan, which continued to form the basis of activities and developments throughout the year.

- → The focus areas of profiling, acquisition, organisational development, and collaboration were further developed.
- → In anticipation of the Fryske Akademy's 85th anniversary on 10 September 2023, efforts were increased to engage with social media platforms to enhance visibility. Conferences were organised, and lectures were given. The national press increasingly sought out the Akademy for interesting content.
- → The 2023-2027 Research Agenda was presented. This agenda will guide the Fryske Akademy in the coming years and is endorsed by the staff and our partners.

- → The Management Team Coordinator for Research Funding and Strategic Collaboration (COSS) commenced, expertly overseeing projects and the appropriate or desired funding.
- → The results of the employee satisfaction survey were presented and will be converted into a plan of action for 2024.
- → With support from specialists at FERS, a Strategic Personnel Planning (SPP) was initiated.

Externally, attention was drawn to the KNAW committee's draft report 'The Future of Frisian Studies', which was released in December. The report outlines perspectives on collaborations concerning Frisian studies and acknowledges the significant and positive role of the Fryske Akademy as a key player, with recommendations to its funders. This will be further developed in 2024.



The successful Neerlandistiek.nl was expanded with Frisistyk.nl at the end of 2023. In addition to general items on Frisian linguistics, history and literature, Frisistics will also provide space for topics such as Frisian in education, Frisian language policy and the language and literature of the other Frisian languages.

## **Scientific Developments**

On Akademy Day, 8 September 2023, the Fryske Akademy officially presented its new research agenda for the period 2023-2027.

The agenda comprises three overlapping knowledge domains that form the foundation of our research: 'History and Heritage', 'Language and Multilingualism', and 'People and Their Environment'. These areas are approached with an interdisciplinary and integrated vision aimed at exploring the 'Frisian case'.

The programme was further detailed into seven specific research themes, often situated at the intersection of two or more of the research areas mentioned above. This approach promotes interdisciplinarity and fosters connections between historical and linguistic research. Our projects frequently involved collaborations with domestic and international partners, including universities, other research institutes, and societal partners, such as the Ostfriesische Landschaft.

Our research was comprehensively supported by 'digital humanities', with an integrated digital infrastructure that combines language databases, digital corpora, and historical geodata concerning the Frisian case. Following the establishment and launch of the agenda, considerable effort was made towards its implementation and further development. For instance, the agenda formed the basis for our website and our strategic personnel policy. Additionally, in 2023, the ties with various working groups of the Fryske Akademy were strengthened to promote citizen science

and re-establish it as a prominent part of the Akademy's activities. Efforts were also made to align with the National Research Agenda and with the objectives of the *Gearwurkingstrajekt Fryske Taal en Kultuer* (GFTK).

Preparatory work was undertaken for the next evaluation, which will follow the Strategy Evaluation Protocol (SEP 2021 - 2027).












#### **Campus Fryslân Science Prize**

Dr Alex Kerkhof has won the Campus Fryslân Science Prize. Kerkhof conducted interdisciplinary research into the disappearance of the Frisian language from Zeeland and Holland in the early and high Middle Ages. RUG/Campus Fryslân intends this prize to stimulate and reward scientific research talent.

## New European project: Read with MEE

The Erasmus+ project Read with Multilingual Early Education (Read with MEE) focuses on promoting the reading skills of young, multilingual children (ages 2-6). The outcomes include a manual and videos for professionals in childcare, libraries, and teachers of grades 1 and 2 with practical tips on supporting home









languages during reading, a collection of storybooks compiled with and for professionals, and a game to assist parents in reading to their children in their home language. The project will run until the end of 2026.

#### **KNAW Early Career Partnership (ECP)**

Managing Director and researcher **Dr Nelleke** IJssennagger-van der Pluijm has been awarded one of the ten KNAW Early Career Partnerships (ECP). This ECP allows researchers to explore innovative ideas or methods for research.


